

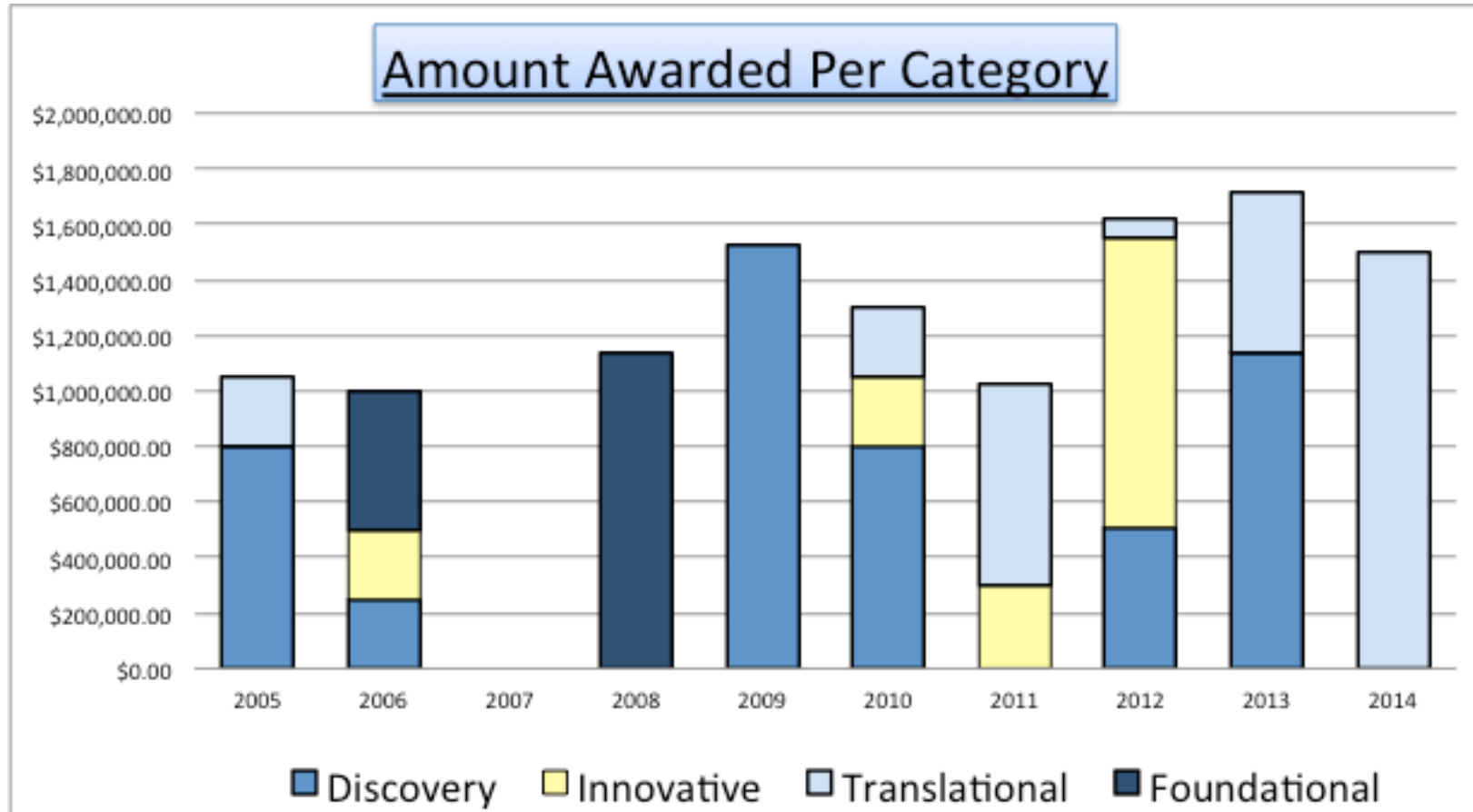
About the Caring for Carcinoid Foundation
